SERVICE STANDARDS

Hotels: We are using good centrally located superior threestar or four-star hotels. We reserve the right to change the featured hotels. Alternative hotels will be of the same standard as the featured hotels both in terms of standard and location. If any changes from featured hotels, final hotel names will be advised latest one month prior to arrival.

Breakfast: Breakfast is buffet style at all hotels.



Coaches and minibuses: Our coaches are new 49-seater first class coaches with air conditioning, adjustable seats, toilet, fridge and possible other conveniences. Depending on sales, some tours or segments of tours and optional tours are operated with new first class minibuses with adjustable seats and air conditioning. For comfort and security we always keep at least three empty seats in coaches and minibuses. Passengers are covered by third person liability insurance. Drivers are driving strictly according to EU regulations. Seating in the vehicles is free.

Tour escorts: Our tour escorts are university graduates and have been specially trained as guides and as tour escorts. The tour escorts are very experienced and most have been working for us for many years. The tour escorts are assisted by local guides if needed or required.

Number of guests: We do not aim at mass tourism. We believe that small groups of tourists allow us to ensure the quality of service. For our best-selling tours we allow max 36 guests on the same tour. However, the average number of guests is around 25–30. For a number of other tours we are further limiting the number of guests to 26. The maximum number of guests allowed on these tours is indicated in the programs. This firm policy secures more value and more comfort for our guests.

SPECIAL FEATURES

Arrival and departure transfers: Guests can preorder private arrival and departure transfers. By arrival transfer the guests are met by a driver with a name board reading their surnames in the arrival hall of the airport. Guests should co-ordinate their departure transfer with the tour escort.

Welcome meeting: During the welcome meeting, the guests are served a welcome drink. The tour escort introduces the program and the optional tours, and the guests receive various materials such as a personalized program and information material.

The optional excursions feature important highlights not included into the standard sightseeing tours and always include transport, guide service and entrances. DAY 1 (FRIDAY): ARRIVAL TALLINN

Arrival in Tallinn, optional transfer to Hotel Radisson Blu Olumpia**** or similar, check-in, welcome meeting

DAY 2 (SATURDAY): TALLINN

Tallinn is a charming blend of medieval tranquillity and modern urban life. The medieval Old Town is a busy place in the summer with its many shops, galleries, souvenir markets, outdoor cafés and restaurants. The sightseeing tour takes us around the old medieval city walls and into the Old Town where we see Toompea Castle, Dome Church, Alexander Nevsky Cathedral, medieval Old Town Hall and Great Guild Hall. In the afternoon an optional excursion is offered to Kadriorg Park and visit to KUMU, the award-winning new Estonian Art museum, with its collections of classic and contemporary fine art. The evening offers an optional medieval dinner at Restaurant Maikrahv.

DAY 3 (SUNDAY): TALLINN-LAHEMAA-TALLINN

This day offers an optional day excursion to Lahemaa National Park, where we visit Palmse Manor, a memorial to the von Pahlen family, and Sagadi Manor. The tour ends with a visit to the charming 13th century Vihula Manor and the Vodka Museum.

DAY 4 (MONDAY): TALLINN-TARTU

We continue to Tartu, the University Town, where Estonia gained its statehood. We see the charming Old Town and the University founded in 1632. Check in at Hotel Dorpat*** or similar. In the afternoon an optional visit is offered to Estonia National Museum, dedicated to Estonian cultural history and everyday life and stretching out on a timeline from the present day to the Ice Age.

DAY 5 (TUESDAY): TARTU-GRASI

Departing from Tartu, we head south and in Latvia our first stop is in Aluksne. From there soon we reach Stameriena - the pearl of European romanticism having close links with Italian writer Giuseppe Tomasi di Lampedusa. After the visit, we continue to Cesvaine where we visit the small, private Cesvaine beer brewery and are invited to test the produce. Later in the afternoon we arrive to Grasi Manor***, a picturesque classicism style estate in the middle of Latvia. This evening offers dinner at Grasi Manor

DAY 6 (WEDNESDAY): GRASI-DAUGAVPILS

Leaving Grasi our first stop is in Aglona, where we visit Aglona Basilica built in late baroque style and a ceramics workshop, an important symbol of Latgalian culture. From here, our tour continues to Daugavpils, Latvia's 2nd largest city. We tour the historical centre of the city and visit the 19th century Daugavpils Fortress and the Mark Rothko Art Centre, the only place in Europe, where the original masterpieces by the famous founder of abstract expressionism can be seen. Just outside the city we find the lovely Sventes Manor and we check in at Hotel Svente Manor****.

Today we continue southwards into Lithuania and in the middle of the day we arrive at Aukstatija National Park with its many lakes, rivulets and streams scattered between forests and hills. In early afternoon we head towards Liepaja where we arrive in early afternoon and check in at Hotel Art Roma****. 




